

## **Landscape Design Services**

### **Consultation     \$100.00**

At this initial consultation meeting, it is important for the designer to collect as much information from the client about their garden site and be able to get a good idea about what the client would like to achieve.

This will form the basis of the Client Brief. The Client Brief forms the basis of all design work moving forward so it is very important to outline all the project objectives.

Please collect some images of garden styles/ plants etc for this discussion.

A consultation includes an initial site assessment, for example factors such as sun, wind, circulation patterns, problem areas, and microclimates, details of house and preliminary soil conditions.

Be prepared to give an estimation of your budget as this will be required by the designer to give you an expectation about what can be achieved.

After our meeting I will draft some concept ideas and notes for you to utilise.

These would normally be sent via email after the consultation process.

A consultation normally takes around 1.5 hours.

### **Landscape Concept Plan                     from \$500.00**

The Design Concept is developed using the **client brief** and information gathered at the consultation and site assessment stage. A concept will not give finished detail nor any specific plant species but rather general suggested treatments and ways to best utilise your garden site including basic plant ideas.

A concept plan will be developed using a combination of hand drawn and CAD software

A final concept design will be provided as an A2 or A1 black and white paper print plus digital copy for further printing.

Process includes;

Draft concept development and presentation to the client followed by further site visits and meetings where necessary to verify site conditions and finalise the design elements.

The concept draft will include images of the plants and materials, this will assist in giving you an overall impression of the garden as visualised by the designer.

Development and presentation of the final design concept plan to the client.

### **The Landscape Planting Plan from \$1000**

The Planting Plan creates a planting layout of your garden and will be able to give you a final vision of the plant material to be used. A planting plan will include a planting schedule containing Latin names and common names of selected species, the number of plants and intended pot size to be planted.

- Planting and site preparation notes included

### **Landscape Master Plan from \$1000**

The Landscape Master Plan refines the concept plan in preparation for landscape construction ensuring correct specification details for materials & construction methods are outlined.

Detailed explanations and drawings of each construction technique will be made so that it can be translated for the landscape construction team.

Presentation of the Specifications Plan will be received as colour A2 or A1 hard copies plus digital copy for further printing.

**Note** The Landscape Master Plan is required in conjunction with the Planting Plan to give an estimation of total costs of installing your garden. It would be encouraged to seek a number of quotes from construction companies. Recommendations for companies can be requested.

### **Landscape Design Council Submission from \$1000**

The Design Council Submission is developed through initial consultation and further site visits and contact as necessary. It would be developed using CAD with the final design provided as an A2 or A1 hard copy plus digital copy for the client.

Hard copies of the plan would then be submitted to Council. The Process followed is:

- Initial site assessment and client meeting
- Draft concept development, planting plan, council requirements.
- Presentation of the final design council plan to the client
- Submission to council as per council regulation and follow up if necessary.

### **Planting Services (Project Specific)**

A planting service is usually utilised in the post concept plan and construction phases of the design process.

- Order and deliver stock to site, organise site preparation and planting staff.
- Irrigation installed
- Gardens finished premium mulches
